Good Mews Inside Scoop

Turn your empty Fancy Feast cans into cash money for your favorite shelter kitties!

The Good Mews recycling program helps turn your used ink cartridges, cell phones, and aluminum, like empty cat food and soda cans, into real cash that can be used toward the shelter's operation. This also helps keep unwanted cans out of the landfill and put toward a positive purpose.

Aluminum does not occur in a pure metal form in nature, which means it has a complicated mining and production process. However, once in its final form it can be recycled an infinite number of times, making it a valuable resource to reuse.

When donating cans, please check to be sure they are aluminum. A good way to test for this is to use a magnet on the can – if the magnet doesn't stick, the can is likely aluminum. Steel is another metal commonly used in cans and will stick to a magnet. The recycling center will not accept any bags that include steel cans.

Ink and laser printer cartridges as well as cell phones

can be left in the shelter lobby. Aluminum cans can be left in designated bins in the parking lot, located behind the structure that houses the dumpster.

These little cans have a big impact. In 2023, the recycling program cashed out 4,830 lbs of aluminum for a total of \$2,176.02 in donations!

We couldn't do this without wonderful donors like you, so please consider setting aside your aluminum to help us continue this important program.

Success Story: Siblings in Harmony

Amy Lee and Tanger came to Good Mews in 2017 when they were rescued with a plethora of other kitties from a hoarding situation in middle Georgia. The brother and sister duo were given a wonderful second chance when our former director of operations, Kendra Ludlow, and her husband adopted them a few years later after getting to know them and falling in love with the bonded pair.

Ludlow grew very close to Amy Lee and Tanger – who are now 11 – since she saw them every day. She learned that Amy Lee demands to be near her person at all times – bossy in a loving way – and Tanger loves to rub up against his people and plop his big body into laps.

“I told myself that if they were still at the shelter when my husband and I bought a house, I would adopt them, and I kept that promise!” said Ludlow.

Amy Lee is a one-eyed wonder with glaucoma, and stomatitis instigated a full teeth removal just before her adoption. Tanger has some limited vision and also has no teeth, but Ludlow says the two kitties are much healthier without the stress of living a shelter life. A wet-food diet keeps them both on track.



Five years later, Amy Lee and Tanger are living their best lives with Ludlow and her husband, who relocated to Alabama last August. As she now works remotely, the two kitties – along with three others and two pups – enjoy getting to spend more time with her. Ludlow says Amy Lee likes to sit in her chair or lap while she works, and Tanger surveys everything from the cat tree by the desk.

“Because they crave affection, this has been really good for them, and it’s pretty nice to have snuggly coworkers,” said Ludlow. “A lot of volunteers loved them just as much as me while they were at the shelter, so I’d love to tell them all thanks for caring for them until they could be mine.”

He accepts some pets now and occasionally gives wonderful head-butts.

Cho is shy when meeting new people and is more comfortable with those who speak softly and approach gently. He loves being with other cats and must live with at least one. At times he acts as a cat ambassador, gently approaching those who are new to Good Mews and simply sits with them, offering reassurance and companionship.

Medical Mews: Mercy's Story

Welcome back to Medical Mews, where a member of the GM staff gets to share a more in-depth look at a topic or case our volunteers may find interesting.

At the beginning of January, an adorable little calico kitten named Mercy was found inside an engine at an auto scrap yard and brought to Good Mews. We were glad she was rescued from such a perilous situation, but after shelter vet Dr. Bhaskaran and our medical team did an examination, it was clear there was a lot of work to do.

Mercy was very weak and lethargic and had serious, infected neck wounds with three separate holes in the tissue. There was even some bone exposure from the wounds! Muscle atrophy and weakness from the infection meant she couldn't stand or walk much on her own. Thankfully, even though the situation was dire, Mercy didn't seem too scared of humans. She was very much a social eater, which helped to strengthen her immune system and regain the weight she has lost.

As far as treatment, Dr. Bhaskaran thoroughly flushed the wounds, removing the pus and necrotic tissue that had built up. There was some concern that part of the necrotic tissue she lost had been from her neck muscles, which could affect her future mobility. After flushing

with sterile saline, the wounds were treated with medical-grade honey, which promotes healthy tissue growth, and Mupirocin, a strong antibacterial ointment, and wrapped in specialized padding. The following day, a drain tube was placed in Mercy's neck to allow the pus and discharge that formed as she fought the skin infection to leave her body and to prevent further abscesses.

For the next six days, Mercy took her oral antibiotics and pain medications dutifully and was very well-behaved when the staff applied warm compresses. She still didn't move around in her kennel much, but we figured out that she could stand and walk, though she preferred to stretch out in her half-moon orange cat bed. After the sixth day, Mercy's wounds appeared to be healing well, so our vet removed the drain tube.

Before long, Mercy was allowed to go into a suite with other kittens healing from their own injuries, and then about a week later, all the kittens were granted full access to the kitten room!
