



TNVR Spay/Neuter Post Op Care Instructions

- Keep the cat in the covered trap until it is released. It can be covered with a sheet or towel. This helps to minimize stress and prevent self injury.
- Watch for excessive blood in the trap and/or extreme lethargy. This could indicate a complication, and they may require immediate medical intervention by a Veterinarian. Please email spayneuter@goodmews.org with any questions.
- Use the trap fork (if available) to safely give the cat food and water and change newspapers in the trap (if needed).
- Return the cat to their original home environment within 24-48 hrs. Do not keep the cat in the cage longer than 48 hours. Stress delays healing, so the faster they can safely be returned to their environment, the faster healing can happen!
- Return them to the original location in a safe area. Please do not relocate cats. Less than 50% of relocated cats will survive. Releasing cats in a different area is considered animal abandonment and is a crime in the state of Georgia.

There are no sutures to be removed unless otherwise specified.
